Development of Staff Response to Council Resolutions 20130606-049 & 20130606-050

July 2013



Background

- City Council proposed two approaches for stronger code enforcement on residential rental properties.
- June 6, 2013, Council passed resolutions (20130606-049 & 20130606-050) directing staff to develop ordinances
- Staff to bring proposed ordinances back to Council within 90 days
- Ordinances review by Building and Standards Commission (BSC) and Community Development Commission (CDC) prior to Council



Resolution 20130606-049

CM Spelman/MPT Cole



- Repeat Offender Program with Registration Program
 - Requires registration after second citation or notice of violation (NOV) within one year
 - Fees assessed to cover cost of program and inspections
 - Requires consideration of prior convictions when considering penalties
 - Stiffer penalties for repeat violators
- Develop comprehensive plan to use existing tools
 - Utility cutoffs
 - Referral to Justice of the Peace
 - Checklist of dangerous conditions
- Develop Performance Measures
- Encourage City prosecutors to weigh heavily on the number and severity of prior citations, NOVs and restrict negotiations with repeat offenders to seek maximum penalties allowed
- Review of proposed ordinance by BSC and CDC prior to Council consideration



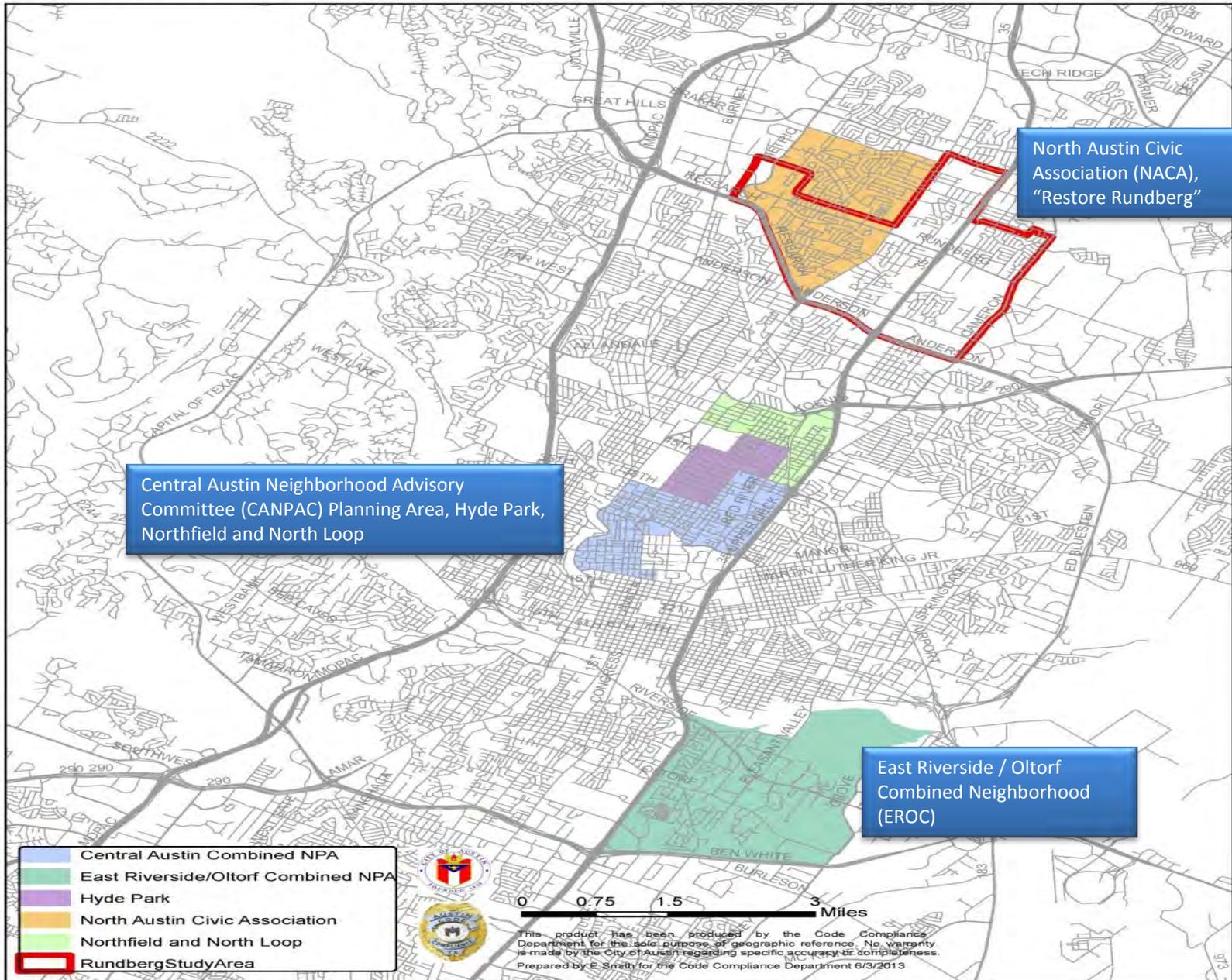
Resolution 20130606-050

CM Tovo/CM Martinez



- One year Pilot Registration Program for any multi-family residential rental property within three areas:
 - North Austin Civic Association (NACA), “Restore Rundberg”
 - Central Austin Neighborhood Advisory Committee (CANPAC) Planning Area, Hyde Park, Northfield and North Loop
 - East Riverside/Oltorf Combined Neighborhood (EROC)
- Program to Include:
 - Fees assessed to cover cost of program and inspections
 - Names and contact information of property managers
 - Periodic scheduled inspections
 - Listing of tenant’s names (if feasible)
 - Conditions under which registration of single and duplex rental properties are required
 - Registration program to address safety , occupancy and other issues associated with stealth dorms
 - Requires consideration of prior convictions when considering penalties
 - Enhanced fines after the first conviction

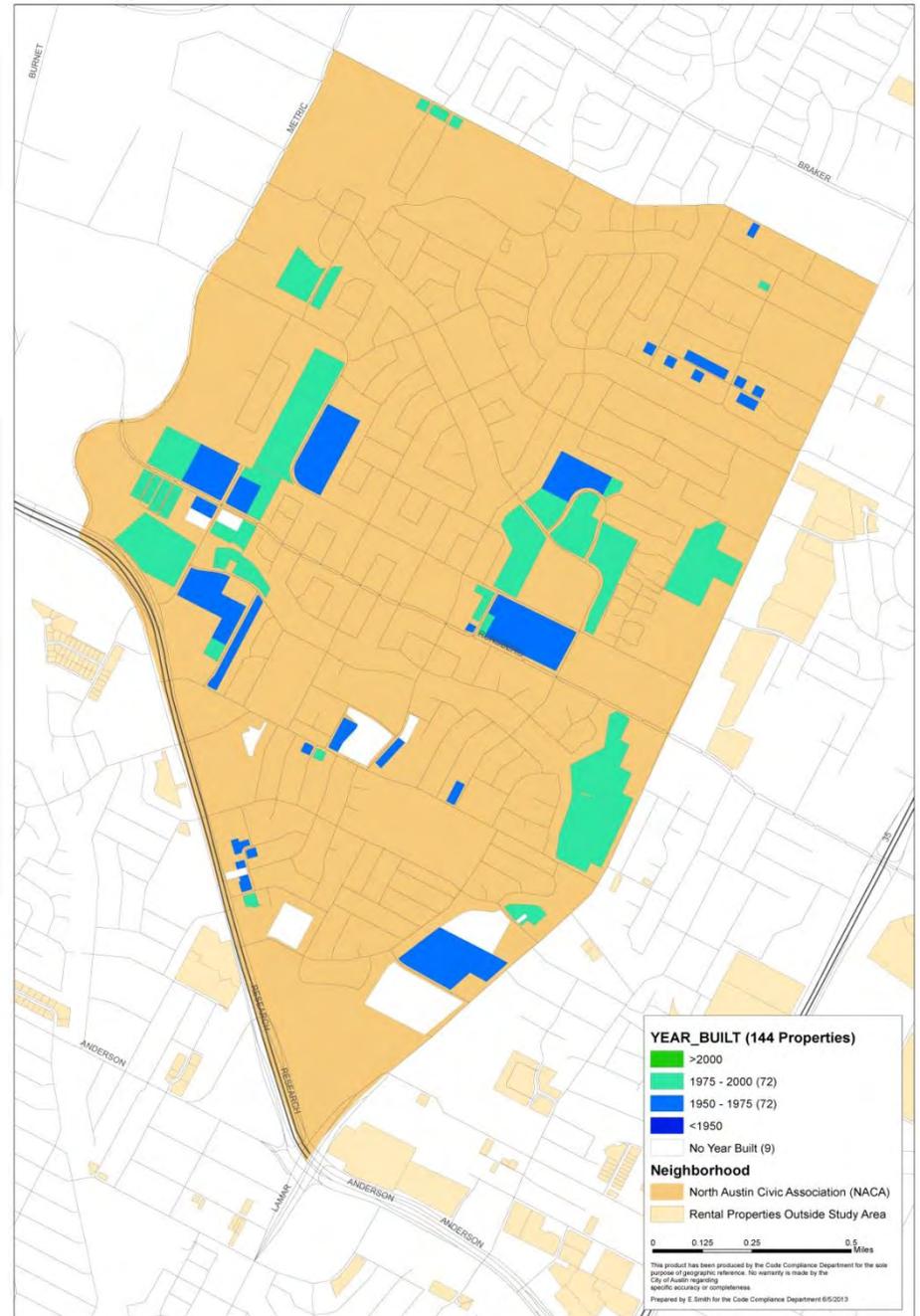

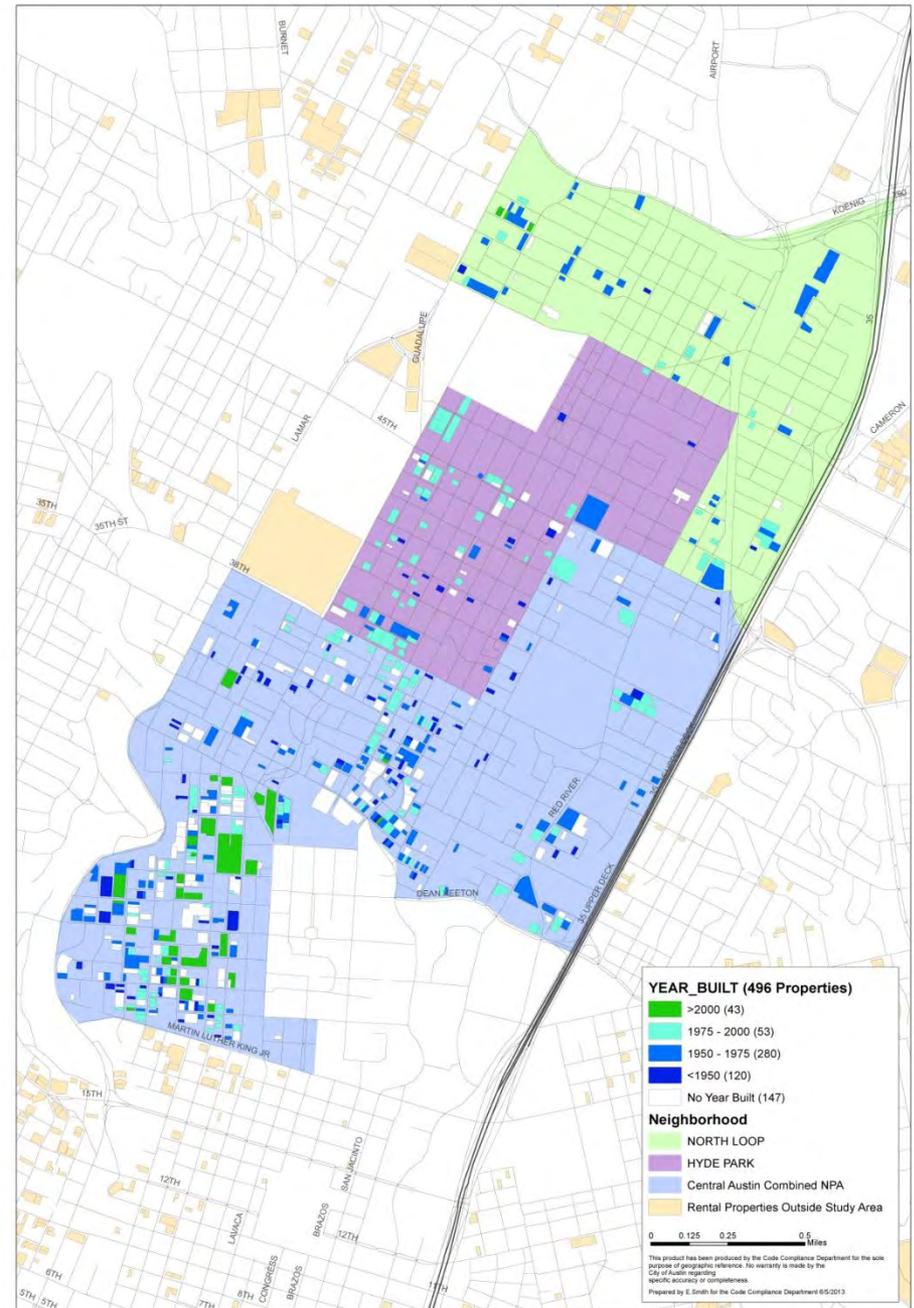
Proposed Areas for One Year Pilot Rental Registration Program

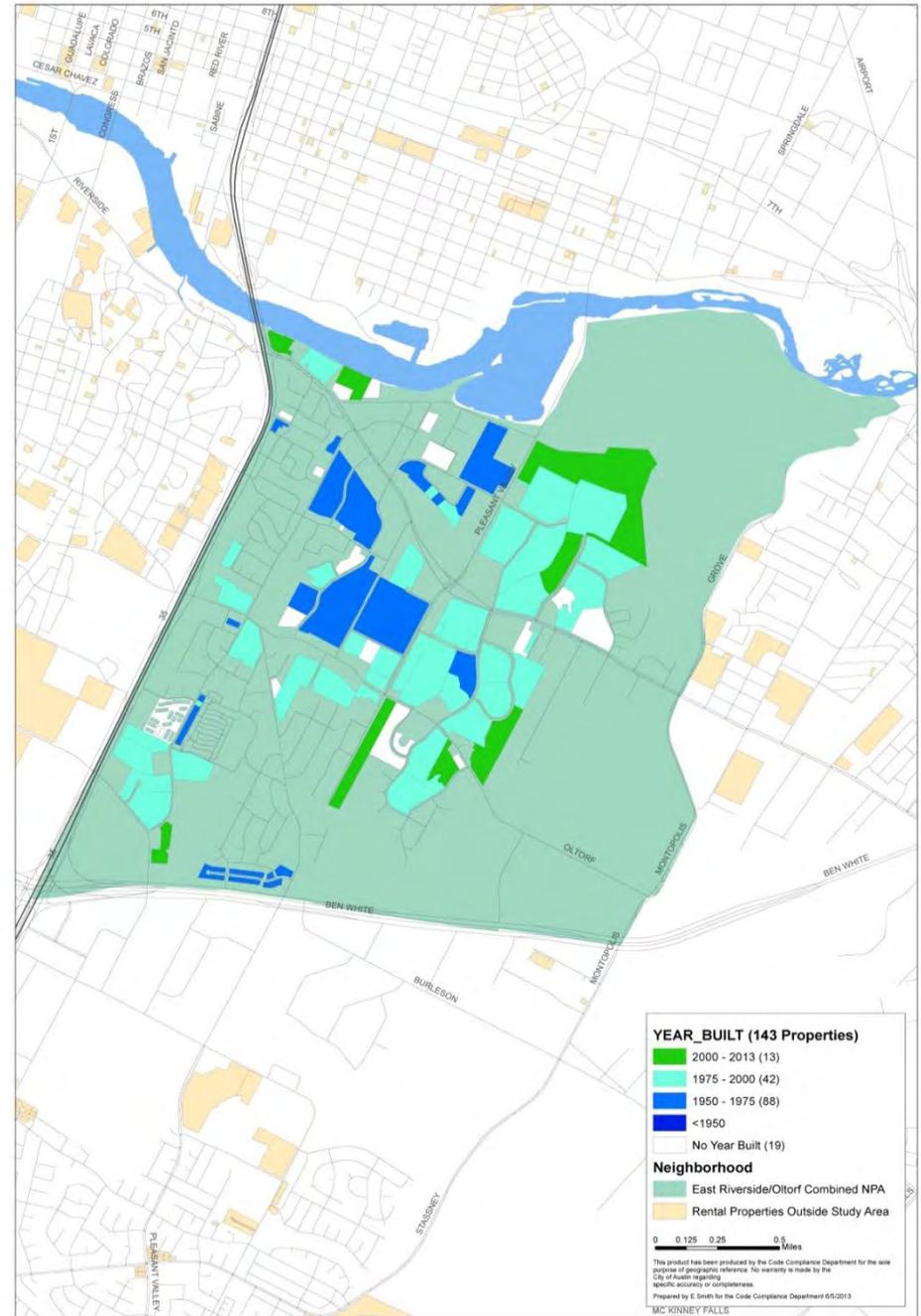
